LOCATION:

This year, CT13 will be held at the *Holiday Inn on the Bay* in San Diego, CA. (www.hisandiegonthebay.com). It is located on San Diego's Big Bay and is adjacent to Maritime Museum and Star of India, with cruise ship docks outside the main door. It is within walking distance of the Historic Gaslamp Quarter, Petco Park, Little Italy, Seaport Village and San Diego trolley.
